1. Go to [www.lexile.com](http://www.lexile.com)
2. Click on “Families” (in orange).
3. Click on the “Book Search” tab along the top.
4. Go to “Lexile Range or Keyword Search.”
5. Enter in your Independent Lexile Range.
6. Enter in a subject/topic, type of book, etc. that you are interested in.
7. Press “Search.”
8. Ten results will appear at a time. Read through the information.
9. Below, write both the title and the author of the books that you are interested in reading.
10. Do several searches in order to cover at least three different topics, etc.
