# Wanted: NAFL team owners

HAMPTON | Pats, beware.

An owner is currently being sought for a new Hampton-based semi-professional football team.

The team, which would play as part of North American Football 3 (NAFL3) — a section of the North American Football League (NAFL) — will seek players once an owner is found.

The team would play against at least three other local teams; the Exeter Gamblers, the Maine Blizzard and the Manchester Devils.

David Dunn, owner of the Manchester Devils, said that NAFL3 is like "high school football for older people."

"Everything's just as

organized," he added.

NAFL3 saw its first action last year. It is the lowest of three levels of play in the NAFL, and plays independently of the two higher levels.

According to the NAFL Web site, "[NAFL3 teams] are smaller market teams that meet the quality management requirements."

Dunn used to play in the New England Football League — a larger local league that already has a Hampton team, last year's Maritime Conference Champion Hampton Hurricanes.

The NAFL started in 1999. Its ultimate goal, the Web site says, is to become a recognized minor league farm system by all professional football leagues — including the National Foot-

ball League.

According to Dunn, the NAFL was only located in the south and Midwest before last year. It is trying to build a stronger presence in New England with NAFL3.

"It's kind of like an expansion league," Dunn said, adding that some of the teams are "startup teams, trying to get away from the other high cost leagues."

The cost of owning an NAFL3 team is relatively low, a minimum of around \$1,000, Dunn said.

"If there are dedicated players, an owner can include a player's fee to help with the cost," he said.

Dunn, who is five years out of high school, said there is a range of ages for NAFL3

players.

"We had guys on our team just out of high [school] up to people who are 41 or 42," he said.

Though his team of 25 players was one of few teams that didn't have a designated head coach, there was still a play book — and his team still took home the first NEFL3 Championship.

"It was the simplest of play books," he said.

Though Hampton already has an NEFL team, Dunn speculated that the town shouldn't have a hard time finding willing players.

"Generally you can find guys," he said.

# Judge Frasier tapped for Streeter trial

Hampton judge has been selected to preside over the trial of Nashua Mayor Bernie Streeter, who was charged last year with leaving the scene of an accident.

Administrative Judge of District Courts Edwin Kelly appointed Hampton District Court Judge Francis J. Frasier to the case after Manchester District Court Judges Norman Champagne and William H. Lyons said they would not hear it.

Frasier did not comment on the case.

"If he talked to [press], it'd be the first time in 25 years he talked to anyone

about a case," said a spokesman from the district court.

Streeter, 69, of 26 Indian Drive, Nashua, was charged last October with leaving the scene of an accident and making an improper turn.

Last week Champagne was slated to preside over a hearing that would determine if a witness in the case should be advised of constitutional rights regarding self-incrimination.

Enter Prosecutor Michele Battaglia of the City Solicitor's office, who filed a motion requesting neither Champagne nor Lyons preside over the hearing.

Mayor Streeter is formerly a member of the Executive Council, which

approves judicial appointments. Streeter was on the council when both Champagne and Lyons received their judicial appointments.

Streeter's defense attorney, Adam Bernstein of Nashua, has said he has no problem with Champagne hearing the issue.

Because of Battaglia's objection, however, Champagne continued the hearing to an unscheduled date. Hampton's Judge Frasier, rather than Champagne, will preside over the case when it is heard.

Frasier, educated at both the University of New Hampshire and Boston College Law School, was appointed to the bench in 1980.

Streeter was not on the Executive Council when Frasier received his appointment.

The accident occurred October 23 at Central and Pine Streets in Manchester, a few blocks from a police station.

The mayor — driving a city-issued 2002 Crown Victoria — was involved in a

collision with a cab driven by Edward Mercier, 56, of Manchester.

Mayor Streeter and Mercier allegedly exchanged words before Streeter got back in his car and parked it in the lot of the nearby O'Malley apartment building. He walked from the lot to the Verizon Wireless Arena, where he was supposed to meet up with family and see the Ringling Bros. Barnum & Bailey Circus.

Mercier left his cab microphone open during the exchange with Streeter, prompting a Queen City Taxi cab dispatcher to phone the police.

Bernstein maintained that Streeter, after parking his car, looked back to see if Mercier was still there and did not see him. Streeter assumed Mercier left the intersection and that the only damage from the accident was to Streeter's car, according to Bernstein.

Police said Mercier and his cab were still at the scene when an officer arrived.

In early March letters will be sent to teachers of the top 100 scoring students in each state and participating territories notifying them that their students qualified to compete at the state level.

State Bees will be held on Friday, April 1. The first place winner from each state level competition will advance to a national level of the Geography Bee scheduled for May 24-25 at the National Geographic Society's headquarters in Washington, DC.

This is the 17th year that

the National Geographic Society has held the National Geography Bee for students in grades 4-8 in thousands of schools across the United States and in five U.S. territories, as well as in the Department of Defense Dependents Schools around the world.

two attempts resulted in finishes of 14th (2002) and 11th (in 2003). But Busch has proven he can run with the best in restrictor-plate races. He recorded a pair of top-five finishes in the four plate races last season, including a fourth-place finish in the Pepsi 400 at
