'Dangerous Crosswinds' plays one night only at Firehouse Center in Newburyport

NEWBURYPORT | The Firehouse Center for the Arts will host a "Visual Valentine to the Granite State" with the showing of the independent feature film, "Dangerous Crosswinds" from Back Lot Films.

This film was filmed almost entirely on location in New Hampshire, with specially selected scenes from businesses, homes and a variety of locations in more than a dozen cities and towns from the Seacoast to the Monadnock region.

This story is about a Pulitzer Prize-winning reporter who hits a career

roadblock and returns to re-group in New Hampshire, where he was raised. Once back, he unexpectedly finds himself at the center of a story unlike any he has covered before — one involving his own role in the mercy killing of a close friend.

The script of "Dangerous Crosswinds," written by Director Bill Millios, centers on Harry Toland, a New Hampshire native and UNH grad, who has built a highly successful career at a New York City daily paper. As the film opens, Harry has just been fired over a controversial book he wrote supporting a person's right to die.

The uproar has proven too much for the paper, and they let him go.

Harry, recently divorced, opts to return to his native New Hampshire, on the Seacoast, to reassess his life. He takes a job with a local paper, which is edited by an old college buddy, and soon learns that the wife of one of his former UNH mentors is afflicted with advanced Alzheimer's disease.

Though a firm advocate of right to die, Harry later begins to question the circumstances and his search for answers leads him on a mini-odyssey of encounters with a wide range of local

people. As clues add up, Harry is forced to confront a reality he never imagined, one complicated by his own role in the death of a cherished friend.

Audiences will not be disappointed, and the local scenery is something quite special on the big screen.

"Dangerous Crosswinds" will be presented at the Firehouse Center on Monday, July 18 for one show only, at 7:30 p.m., with a special pre-show concert featuring Laurel Brauns.
