## CALDECOTTS AND NEWBERYS

The ALA awards one picture book and one chapter book an award each January. The books are chosen by adults who work in the field of children's books.

The Newbery Award is named for John Newbery an 18th century bookseller, is presented to the best chapter book published in the previous year. This was established in 1922.

The Caldecott Award, named for Randolph Caldecott a 19th century illustrator, is presented to the illustrator who has created the best picture book the previous year. The award was established in 1937.

A list of the award winning books is available in the children's room.

The Great Stoneface Award and now the Ladybug Award are New Hampshire's way of honoring some of the great books for children.
